How to apply for Greenbelt River Valley Connector Program Funding

Thank you for your interest in the Greenbelt River Valley Connector Program. All proposal submissions are to be completed online through the Greenbelt Foundation's grant [portal](#).

Step 1: If this is your first time applying to the Greenbelt Foundation, please register your group/organization by completing the [Eligibility Quiz](#). You're now on the grant portal and should see the screen below. Select from the drop-down options and click submit.

Please complete the request to determine eligibility for this funding opportunity. If eligible, you will be required to complete a full registration and organization profile.

Please make sure you have read our [Grant Guidelines](#) Foundation Grant Guidelines before submitting an application. The Guidelines contain important information on the Foundation's goals, areas of interest and the types of activities eligible for funding.

Eligibility Quiz

Does your project impact the Greenbelt?

Is your organization a registered Canadian charity, not for profit, municipality or an indigenous organization?

Does your project fit with the Greenbelt Foundation's Grant Guidelines?

Step 2: Once you've completed the Eligibility Quiz you'll receive an email confirmation from the Greenbelt Foundation and instructions to complete a full registration and organization profile.

Step 3: To be considered for funding under the Greenbelt River Valley Connector Program each applicant must complete a Letter of Inquiry (LOI). This is the only portion of the application process that is required to be considered for this grant. Please be as detailed as possible and upload supporting documents as pdf attachments. You're required to fill in the following fields before completing the LOI:

▼ LETTER OF INTENT

To be considered for funding, applicants must first submit a Letter of Intent that clearly outlines what you want to do. These letters are assessed on how your idea aligns with our goals, expected results of the work and level of impact, along with the strength of expertise involved in the project. The cost of the project is also taken into consideration. Our grant rounds are highly competitive and this will also influence whether applicants are invited to submit a full proposal.

This Letter of Intent requests the following information:

- Project partners.
- Key project personnel.
- Project funders.
- Overview of the project and stated goal and objectives.
- Project results and planned outcomes.
- Evidence of project need and how it aligns with the funding program goals.
- Key activities.
- Brief outline of your organization's history, objectives and current activities.
