Accepting applications from March 2nd to March 31, 2026

The emerging stream of the Park People Nature Connect Fund provides up to \$5000 to support organizations that connect people with nature while fostering ecological stewardship and restoring urban parks and greenspaces. Through nature-based activities, hands-on ecological stewardship and restoration and other forms of landcare, grantees will help people and nature thrive together.

Projects could include:

- awareness-raising or environmental education activities (e.g. species monitoring, workshops etc.)
- hands-on urban stewardship and restoration projects (e.g. native plant gardens or community tree planting days)
- nature-based community activities and events (e.g. nature walks)

The Park People Nature Connect Fund supports local leaders and organizations to sustain, replicate and grow successful projects.

Eligibility

Your organization can be a grassroots organization (unregistered), not for profit or charity or qualified donee and be located in Calgary, Edmonton, Halifax, Greater Montreal, Toronto (Toronto, York, East York, North York, Scarborough, Etobicoke), Saskatoon, Vancouver, Victoria or Winnipeg.

Your project must have positive environmental impacts through urban ecological stewardship and restoration.
